Students began their day at the Cultural Arts Center to view their recent juried art exhibit and to learn more about the economic impact of arts and culture-related jobs in Martin County. They had a hands-on opportunity to work on fictional proposal grants to present to each other. Class members were encouraged to bring out their "inner child" during a stop of the Children's Museum. After a brief introduction from Ms. Calabria, students were able to freely roam the interactive museum.

They traveled to the Elliott Museum, where they were greeted by President & CEO Rob Steele. The students were given the opportunity to tour the current UFO exhibit as well as the ongoing car gallery.
