The students were welcomed to the Wolf Technology Center at IRSC by Dr. Denisha Bonds, Class 28, Coordinator of Career Day and Career Coordinator at Clark Advanced Learning Center. Students rotated through a morning of breakout career-related sessions designed to help them acquire the skills. Students were given tips on business etiquette from alumni of last year's Martin Youth LEADERship. They learned about personal branding from Dr. Nicholas Brown, Master Instructor for the School of Business at IRSC. They also critiqued their own resumes and LinkedIn profiles with Dr. Bonds. Finally, they learned job interviewing strategies from Ms. Roz Johnson Strong, Class 25, Director of Human Resources for the City of Stuart.

In between sessions, the students of Martin Youth LEADERship participated in a Career Fair with approximately twenty local employers. Students had the opportunity to learn more about these organizations as they searched for summer employment, internships and volunteer opportunities. This opportunity allowed students to hone their newly learned skills.

During lunch, students were treated to a "Professional and Casual Business Dressing" fashion show, presented by Suzanne Prior of IRSC. College students modeled formal and business casual looks that are acceptable in today's workplace.
