Owner Robin Boudreau presented impromptu dance lessons, introducing students to basic dance moves. She also gave advice on life's leadership skills drawing upon her experience as a small business owner.



Students toured the Road to Victory Military Museum in Stuart, to see Military Vehicles, WWII Encampments, Weapons Demonstrations and more. Their displays of historical artifacts, uniforms, photographs, and vehicles both historical and personal, pay homage to America's heroes while informing and educating the students of veterans' noble endeavors and our freedoms as Americans.
